

I want to start an anti-racist club

1. Learning

Take time to ensure you have a good grasp of what anti-racism is and why it is important. Read as much as you can from those who experience racism in particular.

2. Approach SLT

Discuss the idea with your leadership, share your passion and learning and make your intentions clear so that no one is blindsided.

3. Speak to students

Get talking to the young people you have relationships with and ask them about what they think about having an anti-racist club.

4. Create a safe space

Offer up a time and a place with a welcoming atmosphere where people can come to learn more about anti-racism.

5. Get organised

Names and titles – build a sense of identity for your club, have ground rules and expectations, and also goals to work towards.

6. Goals and actions

Get your young people to set short- and long-term goals for the sorts of things they want to do and learn. Make it fun and educational.

7. Visibility

Get out in the school community, hold an event, do an assembly or short video for PSHE. Share the great work you're doing within your school.

8. Connect with others

Get in touch with the anti-racist clubs network where we meet monthly to share ideas, ask questions and help each other.

9. Share your work

Get involved with council-wide work to showcase the incredible work you are doing! PARITE23 will be coming!

10. Decolonise your curriculum

Start looking at young people's experiences of school and where they think changes could be made to add more diversity to their learning.
